REQUEST TO RENEGOTIATE AIRPORT AGREEMENT WITH HANSEN FARMS (PER HANSEN FARMS) – Action Item. 7:22:53 PM

Scot Hansen, 440 Clabby Rd, Weiser Idaho. I have kinda three little items that we're kinda mulling over. The first is increasing the current 20% allowance for capital improvements to 30%. The second is the 9.6 acres as you come into the Airport. Because of the hanger extension that happened at the end of last summer, it's an airport so it's already not laid out ideal for farming, we had to remove some buried risers because they were in the building zone, we kinda lost some access and just the way it's shaped. That 9.6 acres which is now like 6 acres, I talked to Jim Metzger the Airport Manager, I either have to let it go and it turns into a weed patch, which he does not want and I don't even want because it just spreads weeds, so I was wondering if we could just drop that six acres off the rent to compensate the extra labor it's going to take to move hand lines around and get equipment in and out. The third item is the extension on the irrigation project that was started back in 2016 by my Dad. We terminated it and rotated the crop out and so right now we have the opportunity to extend that. I just need permission to do that, I have broken down the cost estimate:

900 feet of 6 inch, 100 psi mainline pipe	\$2,000.00
5 hydrant valves and risers	\$ 800.00
2 compression and hydrant valves	\$ 700.00
Miscellaneous Supplies (glue, primer, etc)	\$ 300.00
Backhoe work provided by Rick McDaniel	\$1,200.00

<u>7:26:02 PM</u> - All this I'm paying for, we're just deducting, the City isn't putting any money out. We are just doing it because of safety. Before we had above ground mainlines, so five times a year because we had it in alfalfa we were moving this stuff out along the warm up pad and the taxiways. It's just going to make it buried which is going to make it so much safer. It's moving away from all the lights and everything, so it will be out of the way and we won't have any more mainline out there. I have to watch even when I'm farming I have to watch for planes. We are just kind of finishing this south project so I need approval to do that, increase the deductions and not have to pay rent on the one field.

<u>7:27:00 PM</u> – Mayor Hibberd, that is a really odd shaped field.

7:27:10 PM - Sterling Blackwell, just educational information for myself, when your father started leasing the land, how did they come up with the 20% and how long ago was that? Scot Hansen, I think that started from the beginning in 1976, I wasn't born yet. It was all flood irrigated, it was abandoned basically before that, the life in the soil wasn't great, but as we've done a lot of things and as we got things growing it was hard to get water down the furrows anymore so we had to put in sprinklers. So we've been slowly doing that since the 90's since the actual addition to the original airport back in 1989 or 1990. This will be the last addition to the south side, there's the west side and the north side, I've laid a lot of mainline.

7:28:36 PM - Larry Hogg, the rent now is \$8,660.00, is that correct? Scot Hansen affirmed. Larry, then you are asking us to waive the rent on the 9.6 acre field which is quickly going to 6. How much has the rent historically been on that piece? Scot, didn't know. Larry, my real question is, is this \$8,660.00 going to go down with approval of that? Scot, it will go down a little bit. Larry, so then in turn 30% will also go down a little bit, correct? Scot, it will be a two year project, I can't deduct it all in one year, the 30% is it if you approve that. Larry, so is the project going to take two years or are you just going to deduct it over two years? Scot, the deduction off the rent will be for two years but we're hoping like everyone else, if it stops raining, we'll get in there and get it done. I wanted to do this two years ago but I didn't want to dig a big trench in the middle of established alfalfa. I actually saved a lot

of money because I bought the pipe a few years ago at \$1.75 and it's \$4.50 now. Larry, is this how it's worked historically? Scot Hansen affirmed. Larry, it didn't really matter when the expenses took place it was an accumulative thing that you could deduct going forward? Scot, I believe the deduction begins once it is installed. I need it installed this year, so it will be in this years.

REVIEW OF TEMPORARY "CAT SHELTER" LOCATED AT 738 W GALLOWAY – Action Item. 7:39:21 PM

Mayor Hibberd gave a brief background stating that last summer we became aware of the cat shelter being in a residential zone and we asked that it be closed. They came to us and requested a six month extension and we gave them three months to come up with a resolution. At the end of three months they asked for another three months and that time is up now. Mayor Hibberd then asked John Aegerter if he would come forward and tell us what is going on.

<u>7:40:20 PM</u> – Layna Hafer, just so you know, this particular issue does not apply to John. They're a separate entity and so I want to be careful that John does not speak on behalf of the person that was involved at 738 W Galloway, just clarification.

7:40:55 PM - John Aegerter, I'm involved with Weiser River Animal Shelter and Rescue and we were working to resolve the issue of the cats at 738 W Galloway. Some of the people at the time were keeping the place going by cleaning and making sure the cats were OK at the shelter. About two or three weeks ago the organization contacted the Idaho Humane Society and asked if they had any space for cats, to see if we could move the healthy cats there, they told us they did. When other members and myself had a discussion with Cheri and her ex-husband Carl and gave them this information that we could transfer the cats down there with out any problem, they took it under advisement and within a day they said they wouldn't go along with it because they had found out the Idaho Humane Society euthanize cats without good reason. They supposedly were able to get inside information from there. As it stands right now, and about the same time Cheri asked us to not continue working at her place because she wanted to keep the presence of the cats a bit more undercover. A couple of the neighbors were part of the problem with the City, so as of three or four weeks ago nobody has been working there besides Cheri. She has returned all the items that other people supplied them to her situation there and there has been no communication with her for about three weeks so I don't know exactly what she's planning on doing. We're still hopeful of helping the cats, there are some very nice cats in there and there are a few cat's that can't be transferred, but we would like to get the nice ones out of there.

<u>7:43:33 PM</u> - Sterling Blackwell, I know you are separate from this situation, are you able to give us very briefly an update on where you are with the Weiser River Animal Shelter and Rescue?

7:43:51 PM – Clerk McDaniel, I don't think it's on the agenda, but that's your call.

7:43:55 PM – Sterling Blackwell, in my thought because it was created as a way to help fix this. I'm just wondering because...Mayor Hibberd, I think it relates to it. Sterling, I feel it relates to it, yeah. I know you guys are waiting for an EIN number and the 501 C-3 and those things so I was just wondering...John Aegerter, we do have our EIN and our 501 C-3 has been submitted and by the way things work there, the type of application we made, we should know within a couple of weeks whether or not we've been granted that. There has been an initial discussion with a property owner in the industrial zone south of town, which is where we've been told we have to be. We were so early in the work we've been doing, we couldn't give him any specific information, just whether or not he would be interested. He indicated he thought he would be, but we have to come back with more particulars so he would understand. We have a group, we have eight directors of the group and we meet once a month discussing all kinds of stuff. We have good discussions but realize there's quite a bit that has to be done to actually get to building a shelter. Last week several of us went over to Emmett to visit their shelter, it's been in place for over thirty years and it's an incredible place as far as what they do, how they do it. We picked up quite a few ideas. Tomorrow we're going up to McCall to visit the Shelter there to get some more information on what we need to know to try and design a shelter. We started this back in November, my thought was we needed probably three years to get to a building standing and nothing has changed my mind about that. We have discussed that as a group but probably that long to get this in place. Sterling, well thank you, I think it's a necessity for our community, so don't be discouraged by things that happen, keep lugging away one step at a time and we appreciate the work that your group is doing.

<u>7:46:24 PM</u> – John Aegerter, I'm not surprised either, we want to do this for the city, we want to put this thing in place, we want it to be a good thing to have here. We just hope we can make that happen.

7:46:47 PM – Mayor Hibberd, is Cheri Gordon here? Cheri Gordon was not there.

<u>7:46:51 PM</u> - Layna Hafer, I did reach out to Cheri Gordon to let her know this was put on the agenda. I do want to let the Council know that I do feel like that was amiss on our part. This is a pretty big issue and I know in many circumstances we extend the courtesy to whoever is on the agenda to come in, and she was not contacted. I want to make it known to the Council that she is not there, she was in Boise at a doctors appointment with her son. I do think this was amiss on our part.

7:47:49 PM – Larry Hogg, do we have any idea how many cats are on that property at the present time? Layna Hafer, we do not. Larry, I guess this is my take on it, the owner of this property we have given seven months to disband the cat shelter that she has and to our knowledge she really hasn't done much to accomplish that. Like was presented, there was a month before we even saw it that she was aware that basically it wasn't legal to do at her place. Then, twice as a City Council we've told her that same thing. She went through the process of how her business model which gave us or at least me the idea that within sixty to ninety days an animal from the time she got it would be ready depending on the age of the animal when it was received and she did say that there were some animals that for whatever reason were harder to adopt, that there could be a few that would take a little longer, but it's now been seven months. So continuing to extend her temporary cat shelter doesn't appear to be working. The fact of the matter is, we may need to do something to help with cats that are abandoned or whatever, but I think we've acted in good faith trying to give her a chance to do something with that illegal operation. Despite the fact that whatever notice she got or didn't get for this meeting it came due in December and we extended it for ninety days which would be March, so she has some responsibility as well, given her current situation. I don't see what we are accomplishing by continuing to extend a deadline where we don't have any evidence that she is making any progress in reducing the number of animals on her property to a level that is within our laws.

<u>7:52:18 PM</u> – Mayor Hibberd, what I would propose that we do is give her notice that she has 20 days to get down to the six animals, that is allowed within our Ordinances. At that time we begin citing if necessary.

<u>7:52:44 PM</u> – Cliff Barberis, would that be on the end of March deadline? Mayor Hibberd, the deadline is as of today actually. We did the review with three months from our December meeting, so we would give her twenty days from today.

7:53:08 PM - Sterling Blackwell, Larry I totally see what you are saying, it is frustrating to hear that there was a potential opportunity to off load some of these cats and that avenue wasn't taken, but the human side of me also understands that Cheri has a son that is high needs. So, I understand that some of those doctor appointments she can't avoid and my heart goes to her in trying to take care of that and understanding that her priority is going to be her son.
